From **17 April - 27 June** 2004, Bristol City Museum and Art Gallery hosted a spectacular exhibition of contemporary jewellery.

Jewellery-Unlimited demonstrated the exceptional talent of Britain's new breed of artist jewellers. It confounded many basic preconceptions. What is jewellery? Why do we wear it? What can it be made from?

Although gold and silver are still popular, many makers utilise unexpected materials such as paper, aluminium, wax, flowers, and even concrete.

Organised by ACJ - Bristol this was a landmark exhibition bringing contemporary jewellery to Bristol. A stunning **full colour catalogue** has been published as a lasting record of this important event. With a full page dedicated to each designer taking part in the exhibition the catalogue will act as a lasting reminder of the exhibition. The selected work for this exhibtion was that of the UK resident membership of the **Association for Contemporary Jewellery (ACJ)**; a national organisation founded in 1997 to promote the awareness and understanding of contemporary jewellery. Already it has over 575 members.

The work of **97 jewellers** was on display in this exhibition. The pieces were chosen from submitted slides and disc images by an invited selection panel. The selectors were asked to choose work that they considered to be jewellery at its most bold and innovative in terms of design, concept, materials and technique.

Alongside the main exhibition there was a display of historical and ethnograpgic jewellery from the City Art Gallery and Museum's collection to help provide a greater understanding of Contemporary Jewellery in historical terms. Tools and materials were on display, giving a sense of the processes involved.

The main exhibition showed work that is individual, challenging and innovative, some of which may have confounded the expectations of the general public. The aim was to challenge and educate but not to alienate and, to this end, visitors had the opportunity to get involved through a programme of workshops, demonstrations and lectures.

Programme of Lectures

Lectures were held at:

Royal West of England Academy (RWA), Queen's Road, Clifton, Bristol BS8 1PX

Tasso Wilhelm Mattar, works with traditional as well as unconventional materials with exciting and challenging results. He will talk about his own work and about the workshops he runs on the island of Mallorca. This was held on Saturday 17 April 2004

Dorothy Hogg MBE, Head of Jewellery and Silversmithing at Edinburgh College of Art. Dorothy is an enthusiastic teacher and practicing jeweller who was short-listed for the prestigious Jerwood Prize in 2000. She will talk about her own work and that of her students. This was held on Saturday 17 April 2004

Diana Porter, will give a talk about her remarkable change in direction, later in life, to become a successful jewellery designer. She will focus on her experiences and beliefs that not only inform her designs but also howshe runs her workshop. She is the proprietor of the Diana Porter Contemporary Jewellery shop in Bristol. This was held on Saturday 24 April 2004

Robert Ebendorf, distinguished American jeweller, artist and educator, will talk about his work. Professor Ebendorf, an advocate of recycled materials, has played a pivotal role in the development of modern American jewellery, and has recently had a retrospective at the Smithsonian American Art Musuem in Washington DC. Kathie Murphy - Working with Resin

Following the success of Kathie's book, "**Resin Jewellery**", she took participants through the basic techniques, health and safety and demonstrate further applications using resin.

Maike Barteldres - Sand-Casting in Silver

This was held on Saturday 29 May 2004

After graduating from the RCA in 1997 Maike spent 6 months as guest tutor at a college in Finland where she learned about sand-casting. She is intrigued by the simplicity and potential of the technique, and has made sand-casting an integral part of her work.

During the workshop students learnt the basics of sand-casting and were encouraged to experiment and explore the potential of the technique.

Master Class

This master-class was held at:

University of West of England (UWE)

Robert Ebendorf - Design on the Edge

This was held from 30 June 2004 - Friday 2 July 2004

Robert Ebendorf is currently the Belk Distinguished Chair in the School of Art at East Carolina University teaching in the metals and design programmes. A founding member of the Society of North American Goldsmiths, his work is included in many museums, public and private collections. His 35 year teaching career includes 22 years in the metal programme at SUNY New Paltz, New York, as well as numerous national and international visiting artists workshops.

This three day master-class investigated creative design thinking, using mixed media, paper collage and found materials. There was a series of design projects that the students experienced to enrich their own working vocabulary in metals and enamel. Slides and group discussions related to the projects.
